#### **Code of Conduct:**

At Embrace Your Shine Summer Camp, we strive to create a positive and respectful environment for all campers, staff, and volunteers. Our Code of Conduct outlines the expectations and guidelines that everyone is expected to follow:

- 1. Respect for Self and Others:
  - Treat others with kindness, empathy, and consideration.
  - Use positive and inclusive language when communicating with peers, staff, and volunteers.
  - Respect personal boundaries and property.
- 2. Behavior and Attitude:
  - Demonstrate good sportsmanship and fair play during all activities and interactions.
- Refrain from engaging in bullying, harassment, discrimination, or any form of disrespectful behavior.
  - Follow instructions and guidelines provided by camp staff and volunteers.
- 3. Safety and Well-being:
  - Always prioritize the safety and well-being of oneself and others.
- Follow safety rules and procedures during activities and while using camp facilities and equipment.
  - Report any unsafe conditions or incidents to camp staff immediately.
- 4. Personal Responsibility
  - Take responsibility for one's actions and their consequences.
  - Attend all scheduled activities and programs punctually.
- Follow camp rules and guidelines, including those related to dress code, electronics, and personal belongings.

#### 5. Conflict Resolution:

- Resolve conflicts peacefully and respectfully through open communication and compromise.

- Seek assistance from camp staff or volunteers if unable to resolve a conflict independently.
- 6. Respect for the Environment:
  - Preserve and respect the natural surroundings of the camp environment.
  - Dispose of waste properly and participate in recycling and conservation efforts.
- 7. Consequences of Violations:
- Violations of the Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary action, including verbal warnings, time-outs, or dismissal from camp activities.
- Serious violations may result in immediate dismissal from the camp program, at the discretion of camp staff.



## Safety and Well-being

- Campers must follow all safety rules and instructions provided by staff:
- Campers are expected to listen attentively to all safety instructions provided by camp staff.
- It is imperative that campers adhere to safety guidelines during all activities, including but not limited to, sports, crafts, and outdoor adventures.
- Failure to follow safety rules may result in disciplinary action to ensure the well-being of all campers.
- In case of illness or injury, parents will be notified immediately:
- The health and safety of our campers are of utmost importance.
- In the event of illness or injury, camp staff will notify parents or guardians immediately using the contact information provided during registration.
- Parents or guardians will be promptly informed of any necessary medical treatment and next steps for their child's care.



## **Attendance and Punctuality**

- Campers should arrive at the designated start time of the camp day to ensure they do not miss any activities or important instructions.
- Punctuality sets a positive example for other campers and ensures a smooth transition into daily activities.
- Parents or guardians are responsible for notifying the camp office in advance if their child will be absent or late for any reason.
- Timely communication allows camp staff to plan accordingly and ensures the safety and well-being of all campers.

## **Camp Policies**

#### **Dress Code**

- Please ensure your child wears weather-appropriate clothing suitable for outdoor activities, including sunscreen, hats, and sunglasses during sunny days.
- Comfortable clothing such as shorts, t-shirts, and athletic wear is recommended to allow for ease of movement during physical activities.
- To ensure the safety of all campers, closed-toe shoes are mandatory for specific activities such as hiking, sports, and outdoor games.
- Please ensure your child wears closed-toe shoes to camp each day to participate fully in all activities.



#### **Electronics and Personal Items**

- To promote engagement with peers and outdoor activities, we encourage campers to leave electronic devices such as smartphones, tablets, and gaming consoles at home or turned off during camp hours.
- Campers may bring electronic devices for personal use during designated break times, but their use must be respectful and non-disruptive to others.
- Campers are responsible for keeping track of their personal belongings, including but not limited to, backpacks, water bottles, and extra clothing.
- Please label all personal items with your child's name to prevent loss or confusion.

## **Camp Policies**

#### Meals

- Breakfast, Lunch, and 2 snacks are provided for the youth.
- Our camp provides nutritious meals and snacks for campers throughout the day to fuel their energy and support their growth and development.
- Please notify camp staff of any food allergies or dietary restrictions your child may have, and we will do our best to accommodate their needs.



## **Transportation**

- Please make arrangements for your child's transportation to and from the camp location each day.
- Ensure your child arrives on time for the start of the camp day and arrange for prompt pickup at the end of the camp day to ensure their safety and well-being.
- For transportation during field trips, we will utilize our 15-passenger van, ensuring the safety and comfort of all campers under the supervision of trained staff members.
- Prior to each field trip, parents will be notified of the destination, departure and return times, and any additional information regarding transportation arrangements.
- For the safety and security of all campers, only individuals listed on the emergency contact/pickup list provided during registration will be allowed to pick up any youth from our facility.
- Please ensure that all individuals authorized for pickup are included on the emergency contact/pickup list, and inform camp staff of any changes or updates to the list as needed.



## **Behavior Checklist and Consequences**

#### 1. Verbal Warning:

- Camp staff will provide a verbal warning to the camper, reminding them of the expected behavior and consequences of further misbehavior.

#### 2. Time-Out:

- If the behavior persists after a verbal warning, the camper will be given a time-out, during which they will be temporarily separated from the group to reflect on their actions.

#### 3. Loss of Privileges:

- Continued misbehavior may result in the camper losing certain privileges, such as participation in certain activities or access to recreational equipment.

#### 4. Parent/Guardian Notification:

- If behavior issues persist despite previous interventions, camp staff will notify the camper's parent or guardian to discuss the situation and develop a plan for improvement.

#### 5. Dismissal from Camp:

- In rare cases of severe or persistent misbehavior that jeopardizes the safety and well-being of others, camp staff reserve the right to dismiss the camper from the camp program, with no refund of fees.



#### **Health and Wellness**

- Please inform camp staff of any allergies or medical conditions your child may have upon registration.
- Camp staff will take necessary precautions and work with parents/guardians to manage allergies and administer medication as needed, following the provided guidelines and consent forms.
- In the event of a medical emergency, camp staff will immediately contact emergency medical services and then notify parents/guardians using the contact information provided during registration.
- Parents/guardians will be promptly informed of the situation and provided with further instructions.
- Camp staff are trained in first aid and CPR to respond to minor injuries and medical situations.
- The camp has established emergency preparedness plans and protocols to ensure the safety and well-being of all campers and staff in the event of emergencies, including evacuation procedures and designated assembly points.



#### Parental/Guardian Involvement

- We welcome parent/guardian volunteers to participate in various camp activities and events, such as field trips, special performances, or themed days.
- Parents/Guardians interested in volunteering should contact the camp office to inquire about available opportunities and requirements.
- Encourage your child to share their camp experiences and participate in camp-related discussions at home.
- Support your child's interests and involvement in camp activities by providing encouragement and reinforcement.
- Parents can communicate with camp staff via email, phone, or in-person during designated office hours.
- We value feedback and suggestions from parents and encourage open communication to ensure a positive camp experience for all campers.



#### **Procedures**

- Campers are expected to adhere to the camp's Code of Conduct, which outlines expectations for behavior and consequences for violations.
- Camp staff will address behavior management, discipline, and conflict resolution in a fair and consistent manner, focusing on positive reinforcement and learning opportunities.
- In the event of lost belongings, camp staff will assist campers in locating their items and take necessary measures to prevent future losses.
- Camp staff will provide appropriate care and support to campers in the event of illness or injury, following established procedures and guidelines.
- Parents/guardians can report concerns or file complaints with the camp director or designated staff member.
- Complaints will be addressed promptly and confidentially, with appropriate follow-up actions taken as necessary.

## **Special Needs and Accommodations**

- Parents/guardians of campers with special needs or accommodations are encouraged to communicate their child's needs with camp staff prior to the start of camp.
- Camp staff will work with parents/guardians to ensure appropriate accommodation is provided to support the camper's participation in camp activities.
- Parents/guardians can request accommodations for their child by contacting the camp office and providing necessary documentation or information.
- Camp staff will collaborate with parents/guardians to implement accommodations and support the camper's needs to the best of their ability.



### **Emergency Procedures**

- Camp staff will conduct regular drills to familiarize campers with emergency evacuation procedures and designated assembly points.
- In the event of an emergency requiring evacuation, camp staff will follow established procedures to ensure the safety and well-being of all campers and staff.
- Contact information for local emergency services, including police, fire department, and hospital, will be posted in visible locations throughout the camp facility.
- Parents/guardians will be notified of any emergency situations and provided with relevant information and updates as needed.



#### **Activities and Curriculum**

- Our camp curriculum is designed to provide campers with opportunities for self-discovery, creativity, leadership development, and personal growth.
- Educational goals and learning objectives are integrated into each activity to promote cognitive, social, emotional, and physical development.

- Wednesday Confidence Building Day: Horseback Riding (Games and exercises aimed at boosting self-confidence and self-esteem.)
- Thursday Leadership Day: Starsmore Visitor Center and Seven Falls (Team-building activities and discussions about leadership qualities and skills.)
- Friday Shine Showcase: Cheyenne Mountain Zoo (Campers showcase their talents and accomplishments from the week.)

#### Week 2:

- Monday Wellness Day: Garden of the Gods and Mindfulness Session (Yoga, mindfulness exercises, and discussions about self-care and well-being.)
- Tuesday Friendship Day: Pickleball (Activities centered around building and maintaining positive relationships.)
- Wednesday Diversity Day: Mini Golf (Discussions and activities promoting inclusivity and celebrating diversity.)
- Thursday Goal Setting Day: Urban Air Adventure and Trampoline Park Campers set personal goals and create action plans to achieve them.)
